He also stated that there is an issue with the PAA system, which will be worked on tomorrow and that the 16-inch discharge valve may need to be replaced. An estimated cost for a new valve will be \$20,000.

Street Department

David asked whether or not the city maintains the road behind Kenny Head's property (233 Main Street). After a short discussion, the consensus of the board was that the city has not and will not maintain the old 31E loop.

Recreation Department

Donnie asked the board if they would consider **installing a door in Barry Hall** that would lead to the building on the East side of the building to store the table and chairs. This building currently houses the mower and other city property. The bereavement committee has offered to share in the expense. No decision was made at this time.
