

## **NEW HAVEN BOARD OF COMMISSIONER MEETING THURSDAY, MARCH 19, 2026**

Present were the following: Mayor Linda Mattingly, Commissioner Lois Boley, Commissioner Fred DeWitt, Commissioner Ruth Faulkner and Commissioner Mike Morris.

Also present were the following: David Nalley, Katelyn Norris, Jamie Bryan, Billy Metcalf, Judge Tim Hutchins, Shawn Moore and Joanie Corbin.

The **meeting was called to order** at 5:00 PM.

The **Meeting Minutes of February 19, 2026** were approved on motion of Commissioner DeWitt and second by Commissioner Boley. All voted in favor. Motion Carried.

The **Financial Reports** were accepted on motion of Mayor Mattingly and second by Commissioner Boley. All voted in favor. Motion Carried.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

Lisa Downs, resident of **Philip Court** asked the board to consider putting a **street light** at the end of her street. Commissioner DeWitt made a motion to have the street light put up if determined to be necessary. Commissioner Faulkner seconded the motion. All voted in favor. Motion carried.

Joanie Corbin read the **2<sup>nd</sup> reading of Ordinance # 536 – Series 2026 – P & Z Amendments**. Commissioner DeWitt made a motion to pass Ordinance # 536. Commissioner Boley seconded the motion. Roll Call – Morris – aye, Faulkner – aye, Mattingly – aye, Boley- aye, DeWitt – aye All voted in favor. Motion carried.

Mayor Mattingly informed the Board of Commissioners that the current **credit cards** were going to be switched over to “**EZBUSINESS**” thru Town and Country Bank and Trust. This is will simplify the credit card processes.

Commissioner DeWitt made a motion to approve Mayor Mattingly to sign the agreement to take over the sewer line. Commissioner Faulkner seconded the motion. All voted in favor. Motion carried.
